ACTION TAKEN

COMMUNICATIONS

1. MAYOR BRONIN, with accompanying resolution requesting that the City's Court of Common Council, in accordance with Chapter IV, Section 2(e) of the City's Charter and Sections 26-4 and 2-330.64(f) of the City's Municipal Code adopts the new rates approved by the City's Golf Course Oversight Commission, in the amounts and for the Golf Courses indicated below, all of which were approved by resolution of that Commission on November 28, 2018.
